Death of the Stick Experts now find that the stick shift is dying. The vast majority of cars were clutch operated by the third pedal when I first gained interest in automobiles. Only the rich folks could afford the luxury of keeping the left foot firmly on the floor. All racecars of the era were designed with this feature because it was more efficient than the slipping autos of the day. Power losses from the so-called "automatic"

were unacceptable until the mid 80s. My first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh cars all had manual transmissions. Manufacturers today are no longer offering stick options outside of a few select models largely because the automatics are much more intelligent than their predecessors. The joy of clicking the much faster paddles makes you feel like a Formula 1 driver. Besides, you no longer have to blip the throttle because the computer does it for you. Only old-timers can explain that heal and toe is not a dance step. Gone is the need to acquire that specialized skill to impress the boys as you downshift into a lower gear for the next corner. Their eyes popped when you double clutched the next one. When dragging, banging the next up shift without the clutch was called speed shifting. A blown box was often the case, but thanks to Hurst shifters for making it at all possible.

Porsche's new GT3 will offer the stick once more even though it will cost you .2 seconds for the run to 60mph. BUT, you will carry that manly smile on your face the rest of the day.

Our ZF allows us to choose the gear we want without interference. The Cleveland has enough torque to make our mistake in that selection without complaint. Instead, the 351C climbs the rev counter with aplomb. Pantera can easily take the entire Laguna Seca course in only one gear, third. Just use the left pedal to start in first gear then shift into third. You can't do that with a sequential paddle.

Don't get me wrong. Paddles are fun, but manuals are "funner" to this old-timer.
