



Nethercutt Auto Museum. It is my hope that those of you who attended gained some benefit. My memory of past visits invokes an appreciation of both automotive and non-automotive displays held within. Those at this tour report being astounded by the 1930s Deusy showroom with its marble background and its grand columns. Imagine entering a showroom of the era and being surrounded by such marble splendor and a crowd of multimillionaires. The museum is so much more than that of automobiles. Mascots assembled are worth millions. These simple utility items started as a radiator cap then moved on to a hood ornament and soon became a symbol of wealth and prestige. Many were commissioned by world-renowned artists of the time. So many antiques are among each of the four floors including furniture, jewelry, utensils and a vast music box gathering. The docent was the curator of the music section whose detailed explanation of the collection there lead to greater understanding of the objects. The Victrola, predating RCA, compelled a visitor to touch its paper speaker despite many admonitions from the guide. I pray that the destruction of this sole survivor in the world was not the result. It is clear that such items must be forever encased in glass. Many were taken by the size of the pipes of the room-sized organ. Some of us may recall an organ rising from the floor of the movie theaters first made to accompany silent motion pictures. My hometown contained two theaters but only one retained its organ.
